

Children's Aid, Inc. will award a **one-time \$1,000 scholarship** providing financial assistance to a student graduating from a Calvert County public high school who is pursuing post-secondary education, attending a two or four-year college or university, Trade, Technical, or Vocational School.

- 1. **DEADLINE** for scholarship applications is **Tuesday**, **April 15**, **2025**. (**No exceptions**).
- 2. Refer to the criteria below for eligibility requirements.
- 3. Applicants will be judged on scholastic ability, character, citizenship, community service, and financial need.
- 4. Refer to the application process below for a list of the supporting documents needed (i.e., reference forms, evidence of GPA, etc.) Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- 5. If any question does not apply to you in this application please put N/A in the space.
- 6. Type or print legibly. Illegible applications will be returned to you.
- 7. You will be notified by email in late May regarding the status of your application.

- 9. Scholarship funds will only be awarded to the student's school account upon evidence of registration in an accredited post-secondary institution.

Criteria:

To be eligible for consideration, the student must:

- 1. Be a resident of Calvert County
- 2. Be a graduating high school senior enrolled in one of Calvert County's public high schools
- 3. Have a GPA of 2.0 or above
- 4. Be accepted to a 2-4-year College or University, Trade, Technical, or Vocational School.

Application Process:

Applicant must submit the following items:

- 1. Completed application form (if handwritten, please print legibly)
- 2. Letter of application addressed to the Scholarship Committee. The letter should contain a brief explanation of career goals and biographical (background) information.
- 3. Submit at least one letter of recommendation, no more than two, from teachers, administrators, counselors, employers, or an individual with significant knowledge of the applicant's experience and involvement with school/community activities.
- 4. Please provide a high school transcript. Transcripts do NOT need to be official and copies are acceptable.
- 5. Personal Essay. What are your educational and career goals? Why have you chosen this field of study? Paul Taylor was a Master Mechanic who mentored many apprentice mechanics. The keys to being a successful mentor (or teacher) include effective communication, knowledge and experience, patience and understanding, and the encouragement of independence and curiosity. Please tell us about a teacher or mentor who has made a difference in your life.
- 6. *Scholarship recipient* shall provide a high school senior photo (or similar style photo), granting Children's Aid, Inc. permission for use in press releases and solicitation of future scholarship funding.
